## PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

### TERM HOTS UP

The Term has started to really take off and it doesn't look like slowing down anytime soon. We have said goodbye and thank you to our Year 12 students who are completing final assignments and undertaking exam revision across this week before they have completed all Primary and Secondary school commitments. We held a whole school assembly last Friday to wish them well for the future following a staff served breakfast for them. This Friday night we celebrate with the Year 12 students and their families at a special dinner held in Clare. Completing 13 years of schooling and study is a big deal for all concerned!

Our next focus turns to 'transition' of a different kind. We are preparing to welcome new students to the school at Year 8 along with new students into our Reception class. Both of these transition programs are aimed at making people familiar with our school and preparing them for the start of their next schooling experience in 2018. Our Year 8 transition meeting is tonight and we look forward to welcoming our new Year 8 students and parents to the school.

### CLASS STRUCTURES 2018

There is always some anxiety around this time of year as we continue with the planning and set up for next year. One of these arrangements is based around our class structures. Our structures are always student numbers dependent as it is about fitting all of our known students into a structure that we can afford from within our school budget.

We have not been able to keep our Year 7 students as part of the Middle School and we find this disappointing as we believe that it has had some very strong benefits this year.

In years 8 – 10 students will be together as a year level for some subjects and will be part of a rotation program for other subjects as we meet Work Place Health and

Safety concerns around practical class sizes and deliver a full and balanced curriculum while covering the Australian Curriculum.

Many of our Year 11 and 12 classes will be vertically grouped in order to maintain face to face teaching in the Senior School and offer the range of subjects that students want.

Each year is a balancing act as we try to meet the needs of everyone and still stay within our staffing limits. It is not always possible to meet everyone's desires completely and so **compromise** is always part of the way we do business.

### **STUDENT ALLOCATION TO CLASSES**

This relates particularly to the Junior School where we have Year levels split. When making class allocations we look at a range of factors and in each situation the weighting of the factors may well be quite different. For example, we look at other siblings and try to keep them apart, we look at academic progress and try to ensure that we have a spread of abilities across each class, we look at teacher history and try to ensure that students have a spread of teachers, we look at relationships between students and try to give different students a break from each other and we also look at parent requests for placement within the structure. In one case, the sibling factor may outweigh all others, in another case it might be student relationships that dominate and so the factors vary according to the individual as we place students in classes.

We invite parents to provide us with a choice around placements and to highlight what they see as the **dominating factor around why** their child should be placed in a certain class. These requests **need to be in writing and addressed to the Principal**. Your reason for the request is not able to be resting on a teacher choice as the teacher allocation is done after the class has been formed and we look at the best person to meet the needs of that class. In a number of cases, we do not have teachers even appointed as we are awaiting teacher placements for 2018 due to some of our teachers taking leave or a reduction in time for 2018.

**Parent requests are due in by Friday 10 November as any late ones are not likely to be part of the class allocation exercise.**

### **COMPUTER HARDWARE INVESTMENT**

As previously discussed the Governing Council have supported the replacement of a number of our ICT hardware units in an effort to bring us up to date to start 2018. Whilst we have not formalised a **Bring Your Own Device** plan for the future, Governing Council have agreed to provide support for families wishing to purchase computer hardware for students in 2018. The plan discussed is that the school can purchase identical hardware to that being rolled out for student use in the secondary section of the school next year and then parents can **'rent to buy'** back from us. The units will be fully school compatible and can be provided with some support to ensure that any corruption or additional software required can be added as part of the school network. At the end of your school life with us, we will remove all of our school supported software and you will pay the final payment making the unit completely yours. The unit is proportionally yours and so it travels with your child to and from the school each day and your child takes responsibility for it.

**If you choose to purchase different hardware, then your unit will only be given access to our internet. It will not have access to our normal network for saving work and recovery of lost work. The school will offer no**

**support in relation to your machine and you will be responsible for compatible software to go on your machine at your expense.**

This offer to 'rent to buy' from us is a one time offer as we need to order the units from Dell to have them here as soon as possible. If you are interested in purchasing a computer compatible with the school hardware and supported by the school then please complete the tear off slip and send it back to the school. On that slip is the configuration details of the units we are buying so that you can see how it compares to other hardware you may be looking at.

### **OPEN MORNING**

At our Open Morning on **Monday 13 November**, we will host **Mr Michael Gaunt**, new principal for 2018, and he will attend the morning tea and meet and greet parents and staff. We welcome you to attend the Open Morning and stay and meet and chat with Michael.

He will also be a part of our **Student Free Day on Friday 17 November** when he will attend our Review and Planning Day and participate in shaping our directions for 2018 and beyond. We look forward to his contribution on that day.

### **STADIUM FLOOR SPARKLING**

We have had a resurface of our Stadium floor and it looks amazing. This work has been completed as part of the funding we got from DECD to replace floor surfaces across the school. It should give us many years of service into the future and ensure that the Stadium space is terrific for a range of purposes. The remainder of this funding has been allocated and the contract has been finalised with the work being undertaken in the Christmas holiday break. This includes new carpeting for the School Community Library as well.

### **GOVERNING COUNCIL REPORT**

Our Governing Council met on Monday night and our main agenda items linked to the External Review findings and directives which arrived at the school last Friday. Governing Council members have a copy and we will be discussing the directives and our responses to them at the next Governing Council meeting. The whole report will be added to our website so that the whole community can access to it in the very near future.

A second item on the agenda looked at the way in which we provide parents with reports of student progress according to the Australian Curriculum. Some of the rules have changed in this area with a strong directive from DECD (dated February 2017) as to how it needs to be done. As a school we have been looking at the impact of this directive and found that we have difficulty in meeting the requirements on the first read and interpretation. We have sought additional advice and we have found a way forward with the requirements but it will still take a few years to fully implement. The Governing Council heard some of the complexities of this and appreciate some of the difficulties in getting it up and running. There will be some subjects taught in the secondary section of the school in Semester 2 that will not be reported against as individual subjects but will have their input combined with other subject areas. The comment section will advise parents of this.

The Governing Council then examined the current state of play for our curriculum options for Years 11 and 12 and then across the school for 2018. We had discussions on how subjects to be offered face to face where arrived at and how we balance the requirements of the Australian Curriculum across all year levels within our

teaching staff budget. The Governing Council appreciate that with a limited staffing resource we are not able to meet all individual requests but we make efforts to find a way to give as many students and families as possible what they need for a strong start to the future.

From the Finance end of the school, the Governing Council have accepted the recommendation from the Finance Committee to leave our **Materials and Services charges for 2018** at the 2017 levels. This proposal now needs to be circulated through the school community and at our next Governing Council meeting, it will be an agenda item and community members are invited to provide feedback before the Governing Council vote on finalising the recommendation. This would mean that our Materials and Services charges for 2018 would be Primary Student \$320 including a \$85 voluntary payment and Secondary \$400 including a \$90 voluntary payment.

Dear Families,

The Family and Welfare Support group has been discussing the last couple of terms what outreach to those in need we could support in our own country rather than taking part in the Christmas Shoe box appeal this year.
