Participation in Special Events/Camp/Excursion Attendance Guidelines

When a student has infringed the SBM Behaviour Code for example:

- interfered with the teaching and learning process
- continued disruptive behaviour after being re-directed
- is suspended, excluded for the period of excursion/camp.

*the following procedure **will** be implemented:*

Considerations:

Excursions/Camps

1. Use the timeline of consent/parent notification of the upcoming event as a timeline to reflect/manage behaviour
2. Infringing the Behaviour Code would restrict a students' involvement in a scheduled event. If non participation was being considered the student and parent would be contacted a.s.a.p. and a meeting would be held to discuss thoughts/experiences leading up to this point.
3. Positive restorative behaviour agreements may be implemented to prove student eligibility for inclusion. If an agreement is made it must be signed by the student, parent, camp/excursion supervisor and a Senior Leader. Copies of the agreement would be distributed to relevant subject teachers.

Local events/excursions

1. Where consent has been given at the start of the year, the behaviour in the week prior to the event would determine their eligibility.
2. Parents would be contacted if their behaviour had infringed the school Behaviour Code.

At all times the safety and well-being of students and the reflection of the school values will be prioritised.
